Some Pharisees approached Him to test Him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife on any grounds?"

Matthew 19.3 HCSB



4 "Haven't you read," He replied, "that He who created them in the beginning made them male and female," and He also said: 'For this reason, a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? ⁶ So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, man must not separate."

Matt. 19.4-6 CSB

"Why then," they asked Him, "did Moses command us to give divorce papers and to send her away?"

⁸ He told them, "Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because of the hardness of your hearts. But it was not like that from the beginning.

31 "It was also said, Whoever divorces his wife must give her a written notice of divorce.32 But I tell you, everyone who divorces his wife, except in a case of sexual immorality, causes her to commit adultery. And whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. Matt. 5.31-32 CSB

And I tell you, whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another, commits adultery."

Matthew 19.9 CSB



His disciples said to Him, "If the relationship of a man with his wife is like this, it's better not to marry!" 11 He responded, "Not everyone can accept this saying, but only those to whom it has been given. 12 For there are eunuchs who were born that way from their mother's womb, there are eunuchs who were made by men, and there are eunuchs who have made themselves that way because of the kingdom of heaven. The one who is able to accept it should accept it."

Matthew 19.10-12 CSB

Now in response to the matters you wrote[a] about: "It is good for a man not to have sexual relations with a woman." 2 But because sexual immorality is so common, each man should have sexual relations with his own wife, and each woman should have sexual relations with her own husband.

1 Corinthians 7.1-2 CSB



Lord—a wife is not to leave her husband. 1 Corinthians 7.10 CSB



11 But if she does leave, she must remain unmarried or be reconciled to her husband—and a husband is not to leave his wife.

1 Corinthians 7.11 CSB



12 But I (not the Lord) say to the rest: If any brother has an unbelieving wife and she is willing to live with him, he must not divorce her. 13 Also, if any woman has an unbelieving husband and he is willing to live with her, she must not divorce her husband. 14 For the unbelieving husband is made holy by the wife, and the unbelieving wife is made holy by the husband. Otherwise, your children would be unclean, but as it is they are holy. 15 But if the unbeliever leaves, let him leave. A brother or a sister is not bound in such cases. God has called you to live in peace.

1 Cor. 7.12-15 CSB

A wife is bound as long as her husband is living. But if her husband dies, she is free to be married to anyone she wantsonly in the Lord. 40 But she is happier if she remains as she is, in my opinion. And I think that I also have the Spirit of God. 1 Corinthians 7.39-40 CSB



About virgins: I have no command from the Lord, but I do give an opinion as one who by the Lord's mercy is faithful. 26 Because of the present distress, I think that it is good for a man to remain as he is. 1 Corinthians 7.25-26 CSB



32 I want you to be without concerns. The unmarried man is concerned about the things of the Lord-how he may please the Lord. 33 But the married man is concerned about the things of the world-how he may please his wife- 34 and his interests are divided. The unmarried woman or virgin is concerned about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy both in body and in spirit. But the married woman is concerned about the things of the world—how she may please her husband. 35 I am saying this for your own benefit, not to put a restraint on you, but to promote what is proper and so that you may be devoted to the Lord without distraction.

So, then, he who marries his fiancée does well, but he who does not marry will do better. 1 Corinthians 7.38 CSB



However, if you do get married, you have not sinned, and if a virgin marries, she has not sinned. But such people will have trouble in this life, and I am trying to spare you.

1 Corinthians 7.28 CSB

But if they do not have self-control, they should marry, for it is better to marry than to burn with desire.

1 Cor. 7.9 CSB

Don't we have the right to be accompanied by a Christian wife like the other apostles, the Lord's brothers, and Cephas?

1 Corinthians 9.5 CSB



Deacons are to be husbands of one wife, managing their children and their own households competently.
